Advocacy at the local, state, and federal levels enables us to secure critical funding, impactful policies, and legislative support around key priority issues. Advocacy from our board and staff resulted in recognition as a 2023 Champion for Youth from Boys & Girls Clubs of America, recognizing the top 10% of over 5,000 Clubs nationwide for advocacy efforts.

OUR FINANCIALS

REVENUE

Revenue increased over the prior year primarily due to an increase in net revenue from fundraising events, new donors, and legacy gifts. Fundraising events continued to improve results by 23% over the prior year. Donor Contributions increased 132% over last year due to obtaining support from new donors, targeted fundraising efforts, and legacy gifts.

GRANTS

State funding through the Missouri Alliance for new and existing Club programs increased by \$100,000. Federal funding from COVID related programs was \$54,000 less than the prior year. Locally-funded ARPA grants provided \$188,000 for much needed facility repairs and remodels and the addition of the Club's full-time Community Health Specialist to better support Club families. Foundation grants increased \$50,000 from the previous year directly related to grant writing efforts.

EXPENSES

Operating expense increases are driven primarily by the cost of providing trained, quality staffing and competing with the current labor market shortages and rising wages. 83% of the increase in expenses is related to staffing. Boys & Girls Clubs of St. Charles County still remains understaffed in several areas, a challenge facing almost all social service organizations.
